OVERVIEW

The Need

Formerly a part of the Federation of Rhodesia and Nyasaland, Zambia is now a democratic republic located in the heart of Africa. While the tourism economy in Zambia is thriving, many of the country's native ethnic groups continue to face challenges in terms of living conditions. Life expectancy at birth has improved in recent years and is now around 63 years, but significant health and social issues remain. Approximately 1 million children are orphans, primarily due to parental death from AIDS, although the rate of new infections has declined with increased access to antiretroviral therapy. Zambia faces ongoing public health challenges, particularly in rural areas, where less than 50% of the population has access to safe drinking water, and about 14% of rural households have electricity.

Despite these challenges, Zambia has made strides in health and education. However, diseases like malaria, diarrheal illnesses, and respiratory infections remain common, particularly among children. On average, children in Zambia

attend seven years of school, but many miss significant time due to illness or lack of access to resources.

Our Work

International Medical Relief first served Zambia in 2016. IMR plans to continue to provide community health training, medical treatments, medical supplies and equipment, and clinic operations in order to provide sustainable health care to Zambia.

With diligent planning and preparation, IMR is dedicated to ensuring that specific goals are met on our missions, each in correlation to the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals 3 and 17.

IMR works to elevate vulnerable populations through shoulder-to-shoulder care with our local partners, creating workforce density, and a cadre of future healthcare and public health leaders in association to UNSDG 3: Good Health & Wellbeing.

In correlation with UNSDG 17: Partnerships for the Goals, our organization works in collaboration and at the request of local hosts where we are under their direct influence and affluence. IMR never goes into a country without a formal invitation where there is a great community need for medical or dental care, and health education.

This Mission

Zambia is the only country in the world to have entered the Olympic Games as one country and left as another, after declaring independence from the Federation of Rhodesia and Nyasaland on the last day of the Summer Olympics in 1964. Formerly Northern Rhodesia until its declaration of independence, Zambia is now a democratic republic, an English-speaking country in the heart of Africa, with more than seventy diverse tribes. Its culture manages to blend many disparate values and spiritual beliefs into a single country.

Poverty, however, is rampant in Zambia, healthcare almost non-existent, and education ends at the primary level for almost 75% of children in the country. Zambia is unlike any of the African countries you may have visited. With a strong Asian influence and a diverse population of young people, Zambia is one of the most vibrant cultures on the continent. People are amicable, warm, and present themselves as you see them. This simplicity of life is unforgettable.

Sunday, December 7, 2025

Arrivals

You and the team will fly into Kenneth Kaunda International Airport (KKIA) situated in the capital city Lusaka by 2pm and transfer to team lodging. Upon arrival, you will meet with your team and team leader for dinner and some team time.

Monday, December 8, 2025

Clinic

Today is the first day of clinic! There will be a required team orientation to discuss clinic roles, review protocols and gain insight into the communities and populations you will be serving. You will also review all of the supplies, laboratory testing, community health education materials, and more. You and your team will provide training for local healthcare providers to continue IMR's long-term, sustainable education efforts. Education is as important as medical and dental care for our patients. Each clinic includes basic health education according to the specialties and skills of the IMR volunteers, as well as the needs of the local people. When communities become empowered to take health and wellness issues into their own hands, they become self-sufficient. IMR provides learning opportunities for the local communities through classes and hands-on learning to sustain their well-being beyond our visit.

Tuesday, December 9, 2025

Clinics

Enjoy breakfast at your hotel in the morning and get ready to depart for clinic! Clinics are always filled with families, the elderly, pregnant women, dental patients, and the very sick in Zambia. This is one of the busiest places we go! Your drive to clinics will be relatively short and you will have the opportunity to experience tribal government as you meet the Chief and members of the Council for this area. You will also have a chance to see what the local health centers can provide to the thousands of people under their care. Your translators are dental students, personally selected for service by our host, a professor at the dental school.

Each day you spend in clinic will be extremely rewarding. Working with people left out of the health care system in some of the most impoverished places on earth and making a huge impact on the lives of many will sustain you as much as it does them.

One of the main focuses of this mission is dentistry. Because dental pain is common here and because all community members are encouraged to attend, the demand for dental care will be high. We will have many local dental students and a professor at the dental school available to help translate and provide oral care.

Friday, December 12, 2025

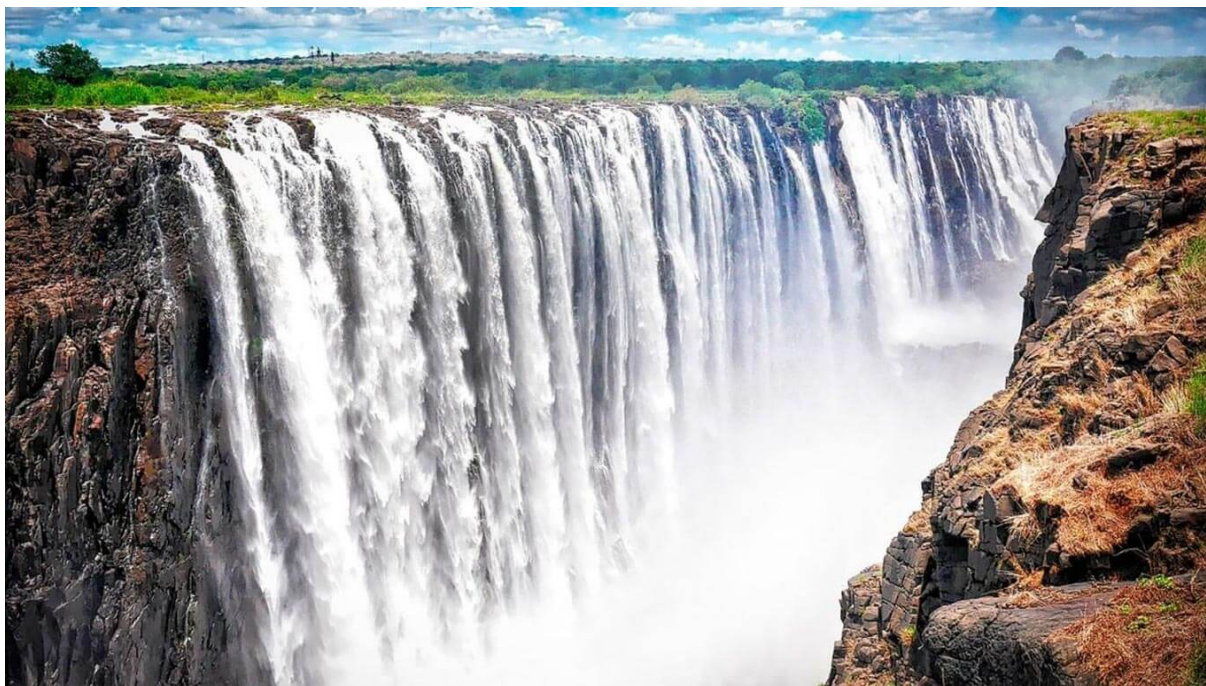
Safari Day!

Itinerary:

Day 1: Travel to Livingstone (Victoria Falls)

Located near the Zambezi River in southwestern Zambia, the bustling town of Livingstone is famous as the home of the magnificent Victoria Falls. One of the original natural wonders of the world, the World Heritage Site is known locally as The Smoke that Thunders. This spectacle is accessible from both Zambia and Zimbabwe and is an ideal place to combine game viewing and water sports. There is much to do including excellent fishing, a thrilling bungee jump and arguably the best commercial whitewater rafting in the world. You can hike around the falls, try zip lining, or enjoy the incredible bridge swing.

Those seeking more leisurely activities can take sunset cruises along the river with champagne and snacks included, meander through the vibrant local Livingstone Market, or discover the region's history and archaeology at the Livingstone Museum.

On arrival at Livingstone airport, your driver will meet you and transfer you to Protea Hotel where you will stay for three nights. On the outskirts of Livingstone lies a hotel that is just as worthy of marvel as the epic natural wonder that lies

next to it. Here, you'll find Protea Hotel by Marriott Livingstone, and if you travel just 10 km from this stunning hotel, you'll find the epic Victoria Falls or, as the locals affectionately call it, Mosi-oa-Tunya, "the smoke that thunders." It's a hotel that complements your travel style. Protea Hotel by Marriott Livingstone has deluxe rooms with electronic door locks, digital safe, writing desk, free Wi-Fi access, international plug points, hair dryer, satellite television, direct dial telephones and more.

Day 2: Botswana! Chobe National Park

The ultimate safari experience unfolds on a day trip to Chobe National Park in Botswana, which boasts the world's largest elephant population. The game cruise on the Chobe River brings you close to brilliant bird life, pods of wallowing hippos, primeval crocodiles, and elephants in their sheer number. The afternoon land-based safari heads deeper into the Park to spot the elusive big cats that call Chobe their home. A buffet lunch is included today.

Day 3: Mukuni Village Tour, Victoria Falls & Sunset Cruise

Mukuni Village is close to the border gate and is home to about 6,000 people from the Leya community, who have lived in the Falls area for many generations. Guides are available to take you through the village to get an insight into the traditional lifestyle of rural Africans.

You will also enjoy a guided tour of Victoria Falls today. A view of the Victoria Falls is something you will never forget, and the best way to see them is on a guided tour. Discover how the Falls were formed and what local customs and traditions surround them. These tours are extremely informative and end with a visit to the local arts and crafts center.

In the evening, your group will experience an African Queen Sunset Cruise. The African Cruise Company fleet is made up of the impressive African Queen, a triple deck 70-foot catamaran and the slightly smaller, but equally luxurious, African Princess. Both offer the charming combination of panoramic views of the mighty Zambezi River at various times of the day, gracious hospitality and great river and birdlife sightings – creating unforgettable experiences that will take you back to an era when time stood still.

Today marks the end of your stay in Livingstone. You will be transferred back to the airport for your onward journey and international departure home.
