

WHAT IS HIV				
1. HIV Human Immunodeficiency Virus	A small germ that you cannot see. It develops into a virus called AIDS. It attacks the immune system slowly. It takes 5-10 years to get sick. It kills the cells that help us fight infection and is fatal.	white blood cells help us  HIV kills white blood cells  white blood cells  germs		
2. HOW HIV IS SPREAD	Through bodily fluids:  Blood – open wounds, unclean needles or transfusion  Semen and vaginal fluids – unsafe intercourse (sex without a condom)  Breast milk  Pregnancy, delivery			
3. HIV IS NOT SPREAD	Does not live outside of the body You can not get HIV from:  • Sharing food  • Sharing a bed, towels, covers  • Insect bites  • Touching, kissing, hugging  • Sharing clothing  • Sharing toilets			



PREVENTING HIV					
4. SAFE SEX	Only have intercourse with one person     Practice safe intercourse where semen, blood and vaginal fluids do not enter your body     Do not sell or trade sex     Use condoms     Do not share razors     Do not touch other people's blood				
5. GET TESTED REGULARLY	It can take up to 6 – 12 months for the virus to show up in your system. Get tested.				
6. DELIVER BABY AT HOSPITAL	There is a greater chance for baby to live if delivery occurs at a hospital where c-section and medicines can be administered.				



LIVING WITH HIV				
7. TAKE MEDICINES & STAY HEALTHY	There is no cure for HIV, but antiretroviral medicines can help you live longer. It is important to take the suggested medicines exactly as you are told. Exercise and eat well to stay strong.	DO COLOR		
8. INFECTIONS	Common health issues with HIV positive patients include: • Thrash in mouth • TB • Pneumonia • Wounds and sores			
9. FIND A SUPPORT GROUP	Counseling provides hope and healing. They can help you stay healthy as long as possible. They can help you learn how to be sexual in a safe way.
